Rucie's Story

At the beginning of February, our healthcare landscape began to change in a way that none of us could have imagined. As the first cases of this new virus were emerging in our country, we were all unsure what that might mean for us. As a mum of four young children, whose husband also works in the healthcare sector, I was naturally apprehensive about what the coming weeks might hold for my family and for the Hospice.

I have been a qualified nurse for nearly 20 years. Despite having worked on an infectious diseases ward in a major teaching hospital, the current Coronavirus pandemic is something that none of us could have anticipated.

As the Senior Sister on the Inpatient Unit at Overgate, we have had to make clear and timely decisions about changing aspects of care, using PPE and managing the care of our patients and families.

At Overgate we feel very privileged to be able to support patients and families when they need us the most. The Covid-19 outbreak has meant that many of our face to face services have been reduced however we are innovating to provide those services in different ways. This includes setting up telephone support lines and virtual counselling and Day Hospice support. We are also supporting our NHS colleagues in the community who are providing end of life care. Our Nurse Practitioner is sharing her vast knowledge and expertise so that those people who are not well enough to be moved to the Hospice will still get our expert care.

I am so proud of my team who have adapted so well to ever-changing ways of working and continue to put the needs of our patients and their families first.

Throughout this whole crisis, I have been overwhelmed by our community's ability to step in and support the Hospice when we need it most. Because you care, we can.

My whole life has been dedicated to nursing. I have always been passionate about providing the very best care to the most vulnerable people in our community when they need it. I spent 36 years as a nurse, including 6 years as Director of Clinical Services at Overgate, before retiring in April 2019. I never thought that exactly 12 months after my retirement, I would be returning to nursing to help the country deal with an unprecedented pandemic.

On hearing the Government's request for former nurses to return to practice, I knew I wanted to help and I knew that the Hospice was where I wanted to be. Overgate is a special place and I couldn't think of anywhere better to offer my help and support.

This April I returned to offer my help with the new telephone line that the Hospice has set up to support those affected by Covid-19, alongside other experienced colleagues. Anyone who knows me will know I am a great listener, and I hope that I can offer some warm, friendly and kind support to those who need it.

At Overgate, every day we help families as they are faced with losing a loved one and then provide vital support as they grieve. We want to use our skills to help our community through this incredibly difficult time. We are here for you.

We also know the immense emotional strain the pandemic is having on our incredible NHS and Social Care colleagues. Our phone line is also open to them. A kind and understanding voice at the end of the phone to help on the most difficult of days.

I am so proud to be back at the Hospice and to see first-hand how they are doing everything they can to help our community during this time.

Craig's Story

Hi, I'm Craig. I was born and bred in Halifax, a proud Yorkshireman! Growing up here I developed a love of sports, particularly rugby, and enjoyed hobbies like cycling and hiking. Since leaving school my work in the RAF and Police Force has taken me far and wide, most recently working in London as a Firearms Police Officer at the Houses of Parliament.

But my life took a dramatic turn when one day I struggled to unload my gun and was advised to see a doctor. Not long afterwards I was diagnosed with Motor Neurones Disease (MND). My condition deteriorated quickly and less than a year after my diagnosis I retired from the police service and moved back home to Halifax with my wife, Ann.

The change that MND has brought to my life is huge. I used to ski with my wife and twin daughters, ride my motorbike in the Sahara, but now I am unable to walk and rely on a Grid Pad to talk to my friends and family. The change has been devastating but I try to stay positive; I am grateful for this time to put plans in place and say my goodbyes.

As my illness progressed I was referred to Overgate and this has been a huge help to me. Until the recent social distancing measures came into effect, I attended Day Hospice every week. All the staff are lovely, and the medical advice is really helpful and means I don't have to visit my GP as often. There is also lots of tea and cake; and a glass of baileys if the mood takes you! My favourite aspect is probably the complementary therapies though; the head massages in particular are really relaxing and a nice escape.

Overgate doesn't feel how I expected a hospice to feel; everyone is all smiles and it's more like a social club, but I can fall asleep and no one will bother me!

Above all Overgate is friendly, caring and supportive. It has been tough to be unable to visit since lockdown measures were implemented but the staff have kept in touch and are still providing advice and support. I miss my weekly visits but I know social distancing is necessary and that now, more than ever, they need our support.

The coronavirus outbreak has caused the whole of the Health & Social care system to look at different ways of working to tackle this unprecedented crisis. Overgate were approached by the local Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) for some help and advice in setting up additional care beds in a local residential home to help cope with the surge in demand. As the number of cases was increasing rapidly, these beds needed setting up quickly and my extensive experience in service development meant I was able to offer my skills to ensure the fast and efficient implementation of these facilities. I spent my time working with the manager of the residential home and CCG nurses, ensuring that they had the full training and support required including extensive training in infection control and ensuring a robust referral process was in place.

This was an incredibly positive experience for me. Despite all the worry and concern, all the staff and partner organisations pulled together to work as one team. Overgate Hospice has a strong history of working for everyone in Calderdale and fully supported me to share my skills and expertise. This collaborative working ensures that we truly get the best outcome for our patients and their families, in the Hospice but also in the community.

Rachel's Story

As the Medical Director at Overgate, the coronavirus outbreak has brought additional responsibility. As the crisis unfolded, working with the other members of the Senior Leadership Team, we spent hours interpreting the ever-changing guidance from the Government and adapting our care accordingly.

The whole team has had to adapt to wearing PPE whilst caring for patients. We have all found it challenging to wear masks, but we know it's even harder for the patients. Usually, our faces communicate as much as our words do, so we have had to adapt the ways we connect with our patients and each other.

We had to make the difficult decision to limit visiting to the Hospice and it has been distressing to see the effects this had for so many. However we have remained committed to ensuring that our patients have a daily visit, and a loved one with them at the end.

As one of only a few Palliative Medicine Consultants in Calderdale and Huddersfield, I knew I could offer my skills and experience as part of the wider response to the crisis. Along with my NHS colleagues, we have doubled the time we are on-call to the community and, have rearranged our working week to offer seven day support to patients dying in hospital from Covid-19. We help make sure they're comfortable and we support their families.

Even though there is a lot of change, things that felt strange four weeks ago feel normal now. What hasn't changed is the compassion shown by all our staff, and I am in awe of their resilience and dedication to caring for our patients.
